a) Drug Name- *Asparagus Officinalis*

b) Parts used: young sprouts

c) Procedure: - for preparation of mother tincture take 100 gram of coarse powder of *Asparagus Officinalis* and mix with purified water (400ml) and strong alcohol (635ml) in old method with drug power 1/10. Total volume of mother prepare by this process is one thousand ml.

d) Therapeutics- Its marked and immediate action on the urinary secretion is well known. It causes a fault and cardiac dejection with dropsy, a Rheumatica cautions especially about a left shoulder and a heart. It used in severe coryza and hydrothorax, Diabetes, Dropsy.

Summary:

For preparation of mother tincture take 100 gram of coarse powder of *Asparagus Officinalis* and mix with purified water (400ml) and strong alcohol (635ml) in old method with drug power 1/10. Total volume of mother prepare by this process is one thousand ml.
